The University of Georgia is located in Athens, which is just over an hour's drive to the north Georgia mountains and the metropolitan area of Atlanta. Total student enrollment at the university is 32,177 students. The university has 16 major schools and colleges. The Athens-Clarke county population is over 100,000.

CURRICULUM: The program is a core-elective curriculum that allows the student to develop an area of emphasis. The curriculum for the first two years is primarily comprised of core courses in the basic sciences with related elective options. The third year begins the clinical sciences phase of the curriculum. The final 14 months of the curriculum consists of clinical rotations.

ADMISSION PROCESS: All applicants must apply through VMCAS. Completed applications are reviewed by an admissions committee. Interviews are not required. SIZE OF ENTERING CLASS: 102

DEADLINE DATE: The VMCAS application and recommendation letters must be submitted to VMCAS no later than October 1. Official transcripts, from each school attended, must be submitted to the college's correspondence address below, no later than October 1. Fall transcripts must be received by February 1 after the October 1 application deadline.

CLASSES BEGIN: mid August. A required four-day orientation precedes the start of classes.

SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION: The College does not require a supplemental application.

ADMISSION DEPOSIT: A non-refundable deposit of \$100 for residents and contract state residents or \$500 for non-residents is required to hold a position in the class.

TUITION AND FEES: For 2008-2009, tuition and fees were \$13,944 for residents, \$38,144 for non-residents (subject to change in 2009-2010). Non-resident students must pay the non-resident rate for all four years.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS: The University of Georgia College of Veterinary Medicine contracts with South Carolina for up to 17 positions, West Virginia for up to 6 positions and Delaware for up to 2 positions. Admission of non-resident students is limited to 10 or less. The remainder of those admitted are Georgia residents. The Graduate Record Examination (GRE[®]) General Test, including the Analytical Writing portion, and the Biology Subject Test are required and must be taken and the results received by our College (institution code **5752**) by November 30 of the year you apply. Results of tests taken before October 1, 2004 will not be accepted. Those who reapply must resubmit all test scores every year. The minimum requirement for consideration is a grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.00 scale **OR** a combined score on the verbal and quantitative portions of the GRE[®] of 1200 or greater. All required courses must be completed with a grade of C (2.0) or better. All required courses must be completed by the end of the spring term before fall matriculation into the College of Veterinary Medicine.

Prerequisite courses for entrance into the college must include:

General chemistry with laboratory	8

Physics with laboratory	8
English composition	6
Advanced biological science*	8
Social sciences/humanities	14
Total semester credit hours	63

*Students should elect upper division courses to satisfy the Advanced Biological Science Requirement. Comparative anatomy, microbiology, cell biology, and genetics are especially recommended. Behavior and ecology courses will not fulfill this requirement.
