MISSOURI UNIVERSITY

The University of Missouri, the first university west of the Mississippi River is located in Columbia, Missouri. This rapidly growing city of more than 70,000 is situated 125 miles from St. Louis and Kansas City and about 100 miles north of the Missouri Ozarks. It is frequently ranked by Money magazine as one of the 10 best places to live in the USA.

CURRICULUM: The first two years of the veterinary curriculum are designed to provide the student with a solid foundation in basic medical science. The final two years are divided into 9 six-week rotations of case-based experimental learning in the veterinary diagnostic laboratory and teaching hospital.

ADMISSION PROCESS: Non-residents of Missouri may apply either directly to the college or through VMCAS. If using VMCAS, a Supplemental Application found on the college website is required. Residents of Missouri are required to apply using the Direct Application, also found on the College website. VMCAS applications will not be accepted from Missouri residents. U.S. citizenship or permanent residency is required. Missouri residents are interviewed in February and March. Non-residents are not interviewed. **SIZE OF ENTERING CLASS:** 76

DEADLINE DATE: Both the Direct and Supplemental Applications for non-residents who apply through VMCAS, must be requested directly from the college website and submitted by November 1.

SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESSING FEE: Required of all non-residents using the VMCAS application form is a supplemental application and \$30 supplemental fee.

CLASSES BEGIN: late August

ADMISSION DEPOSIT: A non-refundable deposit of \$250 for non-residents is required to hold an accepted position in the class and will be credited toward tuition and fees at matriculation.

TUITION AND FEES: 2004-2005: \$14,360 resident; \$27,590 non-resident (subject to change for 2005-2006).

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit scores attained within the last 3 years from the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT) or the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) general. Minimum qualifying scores are 640 (total of verbal and quantitative) and 1.5 on the analytical or a 15 composite score if using the MCAT.

Non-residents must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 and residents a 2.5. Two, or more, years of full-time undergraduate studies is required to apply (at least 60 semester credit hours). Courses taken in the fall and spring semester of the 2004-2005 academic year may be counted as part of the 60 credits.
